1. Introduction

- The meeting was called to order at 6:25 PM by Co-chair, David Brader. A light meal was served before undertaking the business of the meeting.

2. Agenda

- The agenda for the meeting was circulated and approved as presented.

3. Adoption of June 10, 2004 Meeting Minutes.

- The minutes were circulated electronically in advance of the meeting. Additional copies were available at the meeting for review. The minutes were approved as presented.

4. Correspondence

- A Letter from the Village of Pointe-Verte in regards to electing a community representative was read to all.
- Amy Joy Carrier received a telephone call from Cleo Hache stating that he will no longer be attending the C.E.L.C. meetings.

5. Old Business

- Mr. Robert Savoie, a councilor for the Village of Balmoral, was contacted and informed he was accepted as a new member. He was sent a copy of the minutes from the previous meeting and informed of the time and place of the next meeting.
- Amy Joy Carrier contacted the Local municipalities via telephone to invite nominations for new members.

6. New Business

- David Brader introduced new member Robert Savoie from the Village of Balmoral to all of the members.
- David Brader mentioned that he would like to give presentation to the C.E.L.C. on a regular basis to keep the members aware of how things are progressing on site. Members were given the opportunity to ask questions which Mr. Brader answered accordingly.
- David Brader gave a Presentation of the Status of Bennett Environmental New Brunswick Inc Belledune Project to all of the members.
- David Brader read a sample of the next C.E.L.C. flyer to all the members for approval. Paul Deveau inquired where the Truck Scale will be located. Mr. Brader responded that it would be located at the entrance to the site.
- Bernie Lawlor mentioned that Question # 3 on the flyer, "How do you know for sure what is in the truck?" was not answered. It was discussed and decided by the members that a more elaborate answer to this question would be more

appropriate. Flo Guitard inquired if the radiation detectors were sensitive and Mr. Brader responded that they were.

- Paul Deveau inquired about the answer for question # 2, “What happens to the paperwork once it is checked?” Bernie Lawlor asked if the truck drivers will have all six copies of the manifest when he reaches the site. David Brader responded that we will receive four of the copies.
- Paul Deveau questioned where the soil will come from for the test drill.
- Flo Guitard asked if a HAZMAT team would be called if there would be a soil spill. Mr. Brader responded that all employees have been trained for hazardous material spills and an Emergency Response Plan is in place.
- Robert Savoie inquired if the numbers for the stack emissions would be available to the public. Mr. Brader responded that it is something Bennett Environmental New Brunswick Inc. will look into and that an announcement would have to be made if the Thermal Relief Valve (TRV) were to open. Mr. Savoie also inquired what would happen if the stack were to leak. Mr. Brader responded that Bennett Environmental New Brunswick Inc. would notice changes in the process and it would be corrected immediately.
- Paul Deveau inquired about the soil contracts. Dave Brader stated that Bennett Environmental New Brunswick Inc. has begun to focus on the Maritimes to search for soil. Bernie Lawlor inquired if the New Jersey contract was on or off. Mr. Brader explained how the contracts work and how they are competitive. Bernie Lawlor inquired when it would be known who the New Jersey contract would go to. Mr. Brader replied that the Sales teams are working on it and that they do not want to rely on soil from only one source.
