1. Introduction

- The meeting was called to order at 6:20 PM by Co-chair, Gordon Sheppard.

2. Agenda

- The agenda for the meeting was circulated and approved as presented. Edith Morris motioned to approve the agenda and the motion was seconded by Mark Roherty.

3. Adoption of January 27, 2005 Meeting Minutes.

- The minutes were circulated electronically in advance of the meeting. Additional copies were available at the meeting for review. Gordon Sheppard motioned that the minutes be approved and the motion was seconded by Flo Guitard. The minutes were approved as presented.

4. Correspondence

- An information package of General Information for the Town of Beresford Exhibition had been circulated. The members discussed the kind of booth the C.E.L.C. would like to set up and what would be on display. Mark Roherty inquired if the booth would be set up by Bennett or the C.E.L.C. Gordon Sheppard responded that the C.E.L.C. would be present at the exhibition but they would be representing Bennett Environmental New Brunswick Inc.

5. Old Business

- The members discussed some changes to the C.E.L.C Flyer. They discussed distributing a flyer every month instead of every 2 months. Flo Guitard noted that the diagram in the Flyer was not accurate. The truck on the right side of the page should not be there because the trucks are only supposed to travel on the paved areas. Nick Duivenvoorden noted that item # 2 on the diagram was incorrect as well. Gordon Sheppard agreed that the diagram of the building is not accurate and explained where the trucks will travel. Mark Roherty inquired if the truck will be lined in plastic and if so it should be mentioned in the flyer. Gordon Sheppard explained that every truck will be lined with two layers of criss-cross plastic and that something in reference to this will be included in the flyer. Edith Morris inquired about the seals on the trucks and Mr. Sheppard explained the procedure for this. Carey Letts will be contacted in regards to the final changes to the flyer.
- Flo Guitard inquired as to how long the trucks will remain on site. Gordon Sheppard informed her that they should remain on site for approximately half an hour. Mrs. Guitard also questioned if there would be many trucks coming at once and if there would be a line up. Mr. Sheppard responded that there may occasionally be a line up of trucks but they will all be parked inside the industrial

park. The members discussed the waiting time and the procedure for the trucks once on site.

- The town of Dalhousie and Eel River Bar had both been asked previously to join the C.E.L.C. A letter was sent to the City of Campbellton requesting they nominate a representative to be considered by the C.E.L.C.
- Edith Morris presented some information to the members regarding an information booth at the Charlo Fall Fair and Summer Splash. The cost will be \$75.00 per table, \$150.00 for 10' x 10' divider wall with a table and \$200.00 for a 12' x 12' divider wall with a table.

6. New Business

- The Belledune Fire Department Station 2 toured the site February 21, 2005 for a pre-incident inspection. Station 1 had toured the site earlier in the year. A total of 25 to 30 people from both stations have toured the site and received drawings for the locations of the fire extinguishers and other related information. The Fire Departments in Pointe Verte and Petit Rocher have also been invited to tour the site.
- Gordon Sheppard informed the members that Bennett Environmental New Brunswick Inc. is still pursuing tours for different groups in the area as well as an open house. Mr. Sheppard mentioned that the NB Branch of the Canadian Public Works Association have requested a tour in May and as many as 70 could attend. Mr. Sheppard explained that recently a representative from Environment Canada and the Department of Fisheries and Oceans had toured the site.

7. Additions to the Agenda

- Nick Duivenvoorden inquired about the scheduled date for the Compliance test. Gordon Sheppard responded that Bennett Environmental New Brunswick Inc. would like to Compliance test in the first quarter however they require 5000 tonnes of soil to do so. There is now 700 tonnes of soil on site and the soil used in the test must have the maximum contamination accepted in order to test all systems.
