1. Introduction

- The meeting was called to order at 6:20 PM by Co-chair, David Brader.

2. Agenda

- The agenda for the meeting was circulated and approved as presented.

3. Adoption of September 9, 2004 Meeting Minutes.

- The minutes were circulated electronically in advance of the meeting. Additional copies were available at the meeting for review. The minutes were approved as presented.

4. Correspondence

- A letter from Carey Letts regarding the information sent for the new members was read to all by David Brader. The information was distributed to Flo Guitard and Robert Savoie.
- The updated flyer was received via email from Carey Letts and was distributed to all members for review.

5. Old Business

- David Brader discussed the first question on the flyer. He explained that the question was changed to better suit the answer given. The third question was also changed to match the response. Mr. Brader explained the procedure that would be followed if the radiation detector would be set off and how unlikely it will be to receive soil with radiation due to the fact that it will be tested many times before it is received by Bennett Environmental New Brunswick Inc.
- Fred Albert inquired if the third question was necessary due to the fact that the possibility of receiving this soil is so improbable. The members raised various concerns about this question and offered some comments. It was requested that they consider this question for a while and give their comments to the Bennett Environmental New Brunswick Inc. office.

6. New Business

- David Brader updated the members on the progress of Bennett Environmental New Brunswick Inc. He stated that the instrumentation commissioning is 95% complete. There are a few systems left to test and they will be tested within the next two weeks.
- Fred Albert and David Brader discussed some of the possible sites for soil in New Brunswick as well as the requirements set by the Department of Environment and Local Government for accepting soil. In the initial draft to operate the accepted level of PCB's was thirty three parts per million.

- David Brader discussed the recent reports released by the Ministrie of Quebec stating inflated dioxin numbers surrounding the RSI Plant in St.Ambroise, Quebec. Mr. Brader stated that it has not been proven that it is a result of the operations at RSI, and that the Bennett Environmental Inc. stance is that it is not from RSI.

- Fred Albert suggested that the next meeting should be a tour of the site and that each member should bring a guest. David Brader mentioned that the most convenient time for this would be the end of October.
